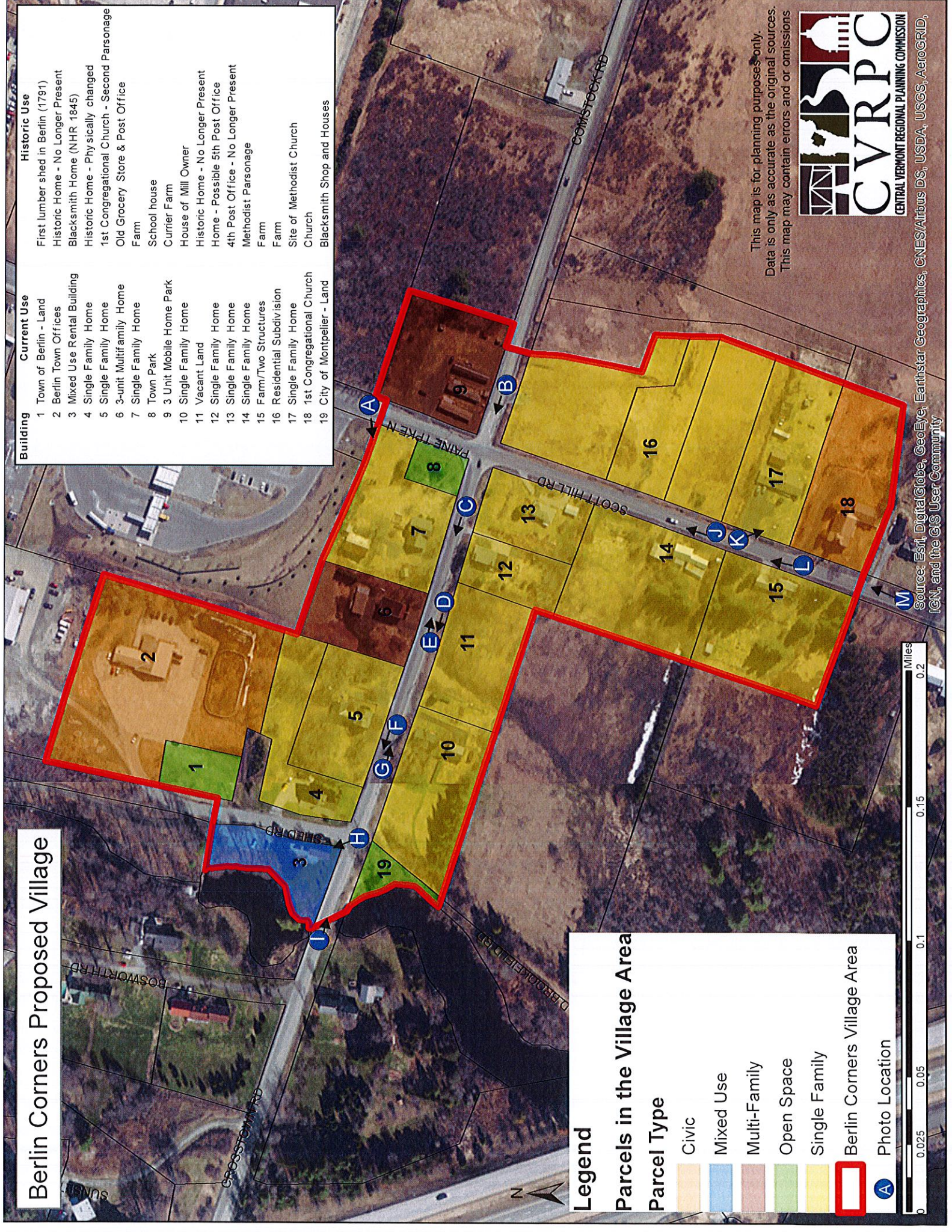

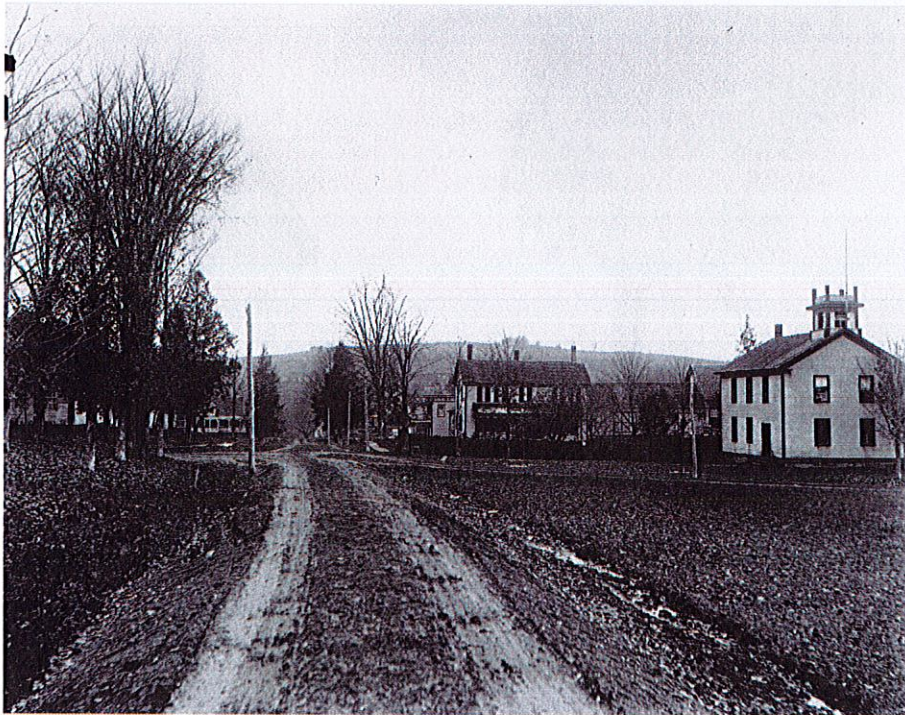

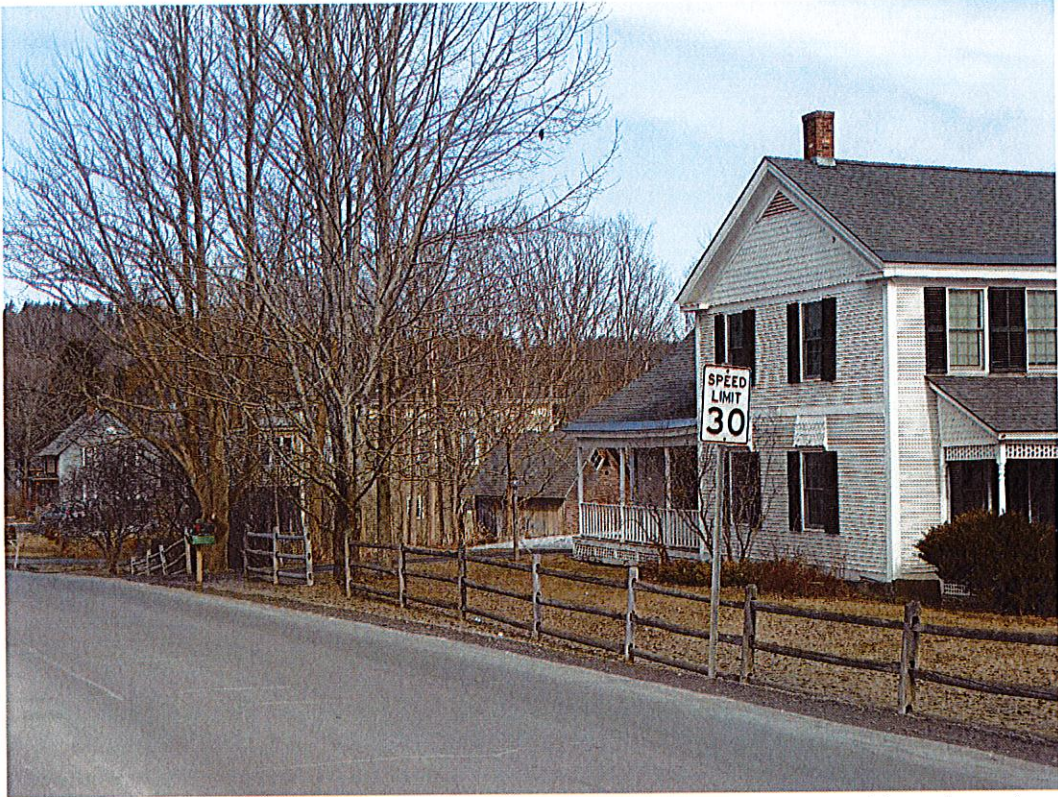




B. Photo of 35 Crosstown Road (Building 12) and 40 Crosstown Road (Building 1) from Comstock Road (West – Eastern Boundary)

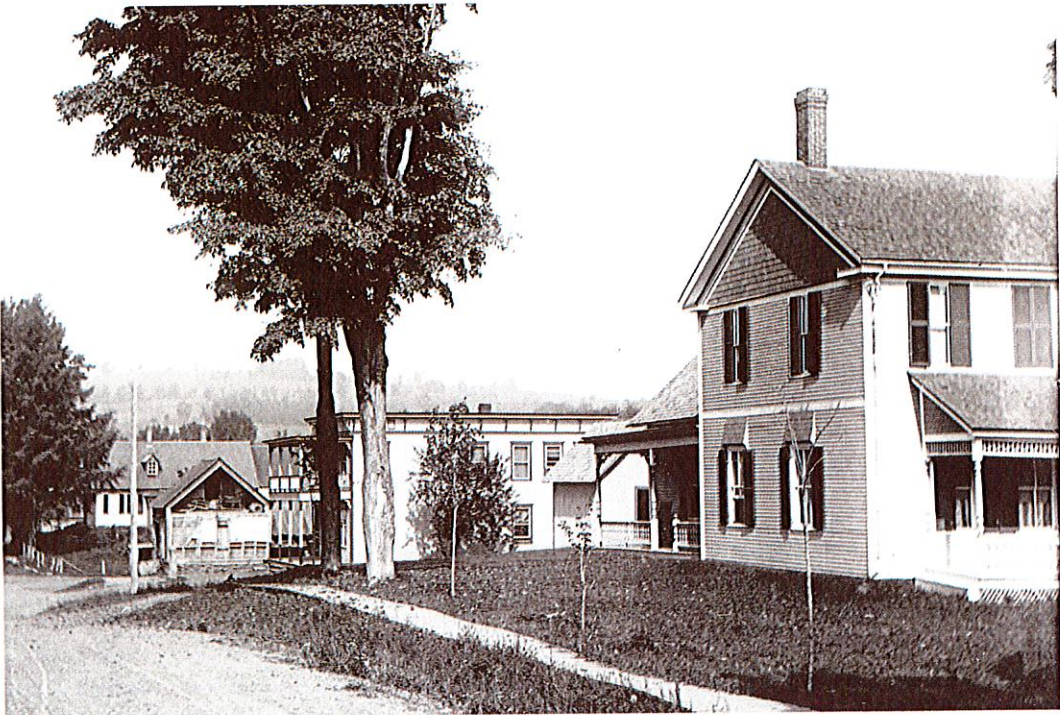

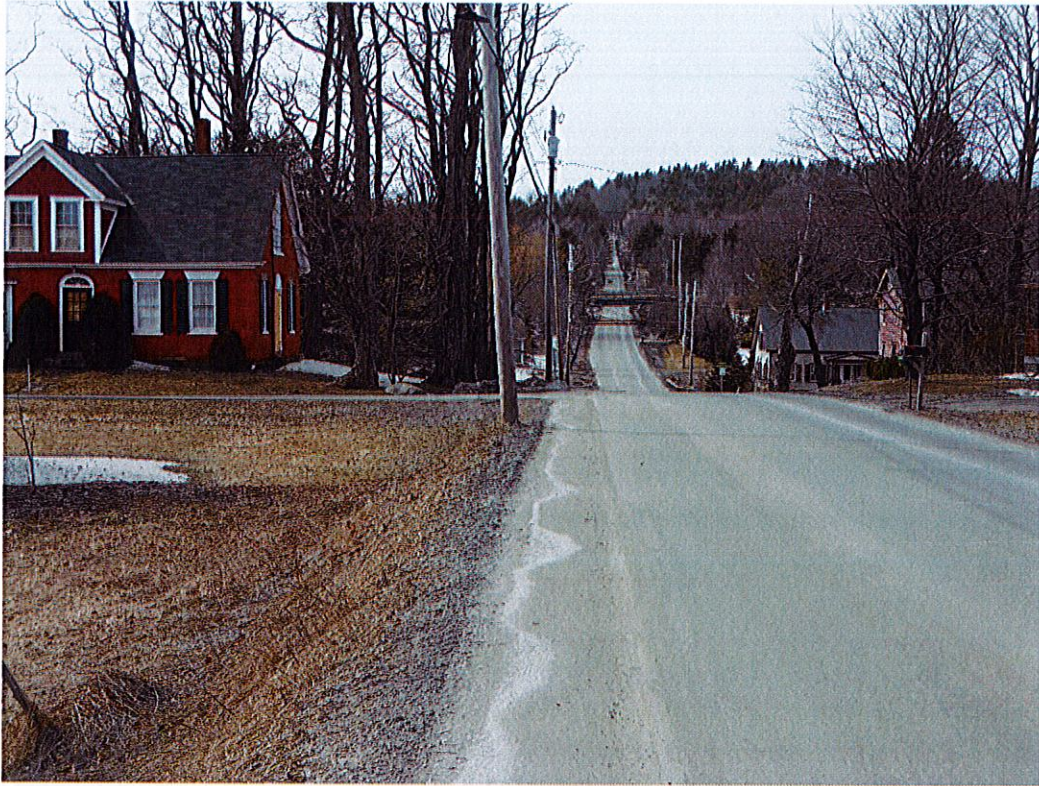
