Boles Cemetery, Berlin, Vermont

This cemetery is located on upper Vine Street in Berlin. Vine Street is off Route 302 East across from Fisherman's Gallery. When you get to the top of the hill you must go through a farm yard. It is advisable to let the occupants know what you are there for. We found them to be very cooperative. The Cemetery is enclosed in a chain link fence but at the time we visited it, it had not been mowed and the small markers were not visible until we started really combing through the tall grass. Understand it was mowed later in the summer. Visited and recorded by Ruth Hoffman and Jennie Winters.

Side 1. Abel Sawyer, died Nov.13, 1836, Age 76 years. Abigail, his wife, died, Dec. 1861, Age 86.

Side 3. Moses H Sawyer, died Apr. 27, 1861, age 72 ys Abel Sawyer, Jr. Died, Sept.3, 1852, age 43.

Side 4. Rebecca Sawyer, died Oct. 13, 1878, age 76 Yrs.

There is a Marker with the name Abel, revolutionary soldier 1775 - 1783 that has a DAR marker with a flag. Four markers reading from left to right read: Abigail, Moses, Abel, Jr., Rebecca.
