

Town of Berlin Poll Workers Guide

Standards of Conduct

- I will maintain strict political impartiality at all times. I will make judgements based on the highest standards for accuracy of information and impartiality of analysis, distinguishing subjective factors from objective evidence, and I will base all of my conclusions on factual and verifiable evidence. I will avoid discussions which involve my opinion on articles on the ballot while inside the polling place.
- I will not obstruct the election process. I will respect state and federal laws and the authority of election officials, and will maintain a respectful attitude toward all voters. Where I have objections or concerns I will elevate them through established channels.
- I will protect the integrity of the election and will follow the instructions and training provided by the Town of Berlin. I will read all training materials and briefings as requested. As a worker, I will refrain from making personal comments, observations, or conclusions to the news media or the public unless specifically instructed otherwise by the responsible official.
- I will read and understand the Town of Berlin Poll Workers Guide. I hereby pledge that I will follow the Standards of Conduct and that all of my activities will be conducted completely in accordance with it. I have no conflicts of interest political, economic, or other that will interfere with my ability to act in an impartial manner and to follow the Code of Conduct.

Information for Flection Workers

Pollworker Instruction for General and Local Elections:

- Ask for the voter's name
- Repeat it back to them
- Mark a check in the box next to the name
- Give the voter the ballot(s)

Pollworker Instruction for Presidential Primary Elections:

- Ask for the voter's name
- Repeat it back to them
- Mark a check in the box next to the name
- Inform the voter that they must declare which major party ballot they wish to vote. They can only select ONE.
- Give the voter the ballot which coincides with the party they requested.

Pollworker Instruction for State-wide Primary Elections:

- Ask for the voter's name
- Repeat it back to them
- Mark a check in the box next to the name
- Instruct the voter that they have BOTH major parties, but can vote only ONE ballot
- Give the personal BOTH ballots
- The voter will place unvoted ballots in the unvoted ballots box. The ONE voted ballot will be inserted into the tabulator by the voter.

Voters are the only people (other than the election officer) who can insert a ballot into the tabulator. Election officials are not permitted to assist the voter other than giving verbal instruction regarding placement of the ballot into the tabulator machine. Please ensure that well-meaning voters do not offer this job to anyone else. See the Presiding Officer if a ballot is rejected by the tabulator.

Please send voters to the Presiding Officer IF:

- The voter is not on the checklist
- The voter's name has changed
- The voter checks in to vote and their name is already checked
- The voter makes a mistake on their ballot and requests another one
- The voter accidentally votes on more than one ballot during the Presidential Primary election
